# The SSJNN Makes the Mission Possible

Jenn Kennedy was the guest speaker at the recent SSI Associates' Come Back event. lenn, who used to work for the congregation as executive assistant, now works for the SSI Neighborhood Network as its donor relations and volunteer coordinator. She provided an update on the SSINN activities, and reminded us that the Neighborhood Network was established as our response to the needs of neighborhoods in crisis. The SSJNN began 23 years ago to serve the "Little Italy" area, but has since expanded to include all neighborhoods between 12<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> Streets

from Cranberry Street to East Avenue. The services provided include a soup kitchen, an emergency food and household pantry, family advocacy and referral, community gardening, and housing and revitalization. In addition, there are several activities for youth including art/enrichment, career awareness offerings, supported work experiences, homework assistance, tutoring, mentoring and bike programs.

It is evident that the SSJNN staff is carrying out its mission: Sponsored by the Sisters of St. Joseph of Northwestern Pennsylvania, and inspired by

their mission of unity, the SSJ Neighborhood Network responds to the changing needs of the world by partnering with local residents and the broader community to provide growth and neighborhood revitalization.

Gathering fruits of the listening and consultations at the individual, parish, diocesan, and regional levels, was summarized into the seven continental reports that has brought the insights and tensions that resonated most strongly with the experience of Church on each continent and to identify from the

perspective from each continent, the priorities to be addressed in the first session of the Synodal Assembly scheduled to begin October 4, 2023.

The purpose of the synodal process is not to produce documents but to open horizons for the fulfillment of the Church's

mission.

**Tuesday, October 24** 10:00-11:00 a.m. and 1:15 - 2:15 p.m.


Wednesday, October 25 6:00-7:00 p.m.

the soldier. It is incredibly satisfying to transform an unreadable stone into one that is not only legible, but now renews the memory of the buried soldier. As of September 20,

Mary Jane's team has cleaned more than 200 gravestones. There is much more work to be done as there are more than 1,500 gravestones in that cemetery alone.

# Making the Cancer Fight a Top Priority from Erie to D.C.

Last week, I had the honor of representing Pennsylvania on Capital Hill. Along with nearly 700 of my fellow American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network advocates from across the country, I traveled to Washington, D.C., to urge lawmakers to make cancer a national priority.

Together we called on Congress to support lifesaving policies that help people prevent and treat cancer. We asked legislators for their support in increasing federal funding for cancer research and prevention. In addition, we asked for support of the Multi-Cancer Early Detection Tests (MCED) bill. The MCED test screens for more than 50 cancers with a single blood draw. This legislation would

create a pathway for Medicare to cover this technology following FDA approval. Our third ask was for support of the Prostate-Specific Antigen Screening for High Risk Insured Men (PSA Screening for HIM). If the legislation is passed, men at high risk of developing prostate cancer would be able to get prostate cancer screenings with no out-of-pocket costs such as deductibles, copayments, or coinsurances.

With about 1,670 people dying from cancer daily, our lawmakers must take legislative action on these crucial issues. Congress should seize the opportunity to pass critical bipartisan legislation to help save lives and end cancer

as we know it, for everyone. I have been traveling to both Washington and Harrisburg for many years to advocate for causes that are near and dear to my heart. I urge everyone, if you have a passion for a cause and there is legislation that could help, get involved with an organization and tell your story.
