After the assembly ended, Sr. Carol and I stayed on to see some of the sights. We toured the sixth floor JFK Museum, a short walk from our hotel. To paraphrase our neighbor, Valerie Carlson, who went shopping for us, "that's what neighbors are for, to help one another." 

We're Doing Our Part, With Everyone's Help

The Sisters of St. Joseph have made reducing their carbon footprint a priority for many years. In our efforts to do more and network with other likeminded groups, we became a founding partner in Erie 2030. The Erie 2030 District includes 19 Property Partners with 128 buildings totaling 7.8 million square feet. The goal of the district is to reduce carbon dioxide emissions in the environment by 50-65% by 2030, and reach zero carbon emissions by 2040.

Each month, the property owners record data on energy consumption. Last week, the District's 2022 data was shared. There was an overall 41.4% reduction in carbon emissions, a 16.6% energy reduction which translates to 33,000 metric tons of carbon dioxide emission avoided. This reduction equates to a \$3 million annual utility cost savings.

We will continue to look for ways to reduce our carbon footprint through education, energy efficient purchases, and maintenance.

What can you do to help? Each year, from September 1st to October 4th, the Christian family unites to celebrate the "Season of Creation." It is a time of prayer and action to protect our common home. This year's theme is "Let Justice and Peace Flow." Each week, we will email a calendar. It will have a daily SSJ maxim to pray with, and an action step to take toward protecting our common home.
