## **Memorial Service—A Reflection**

My name is Cindy Grucza and I became an Associate of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Northwestern Pennsylvania in the year 2000. I was truly blessed to have Sister Betty Ruza as my mentor. Being a part of the Associate program and trying to live the charism and ministry of neighbor with neighbor and neighbor with God has been a challenge and a blessing in my life. We are gathered here today to love, remember, and honor our loved ones - the Sisters of St. Joseph and Associates who have passed away since our last memorial service in June of 2021.

I was asked to share a couple of reflections about grief that

have deeply touched my heart. I also have lost a loved one. In April of 2020, my son Joe, passed away from the Covid 19 virus. Needless to say, when you lose a loved

one it is a devastating time in everyone's life. They say a picture is worth a thousand words. A fellow Associate and friend had sent me a beautiful sympathy card that read: We see those we love in every tree and flower, in every sunrise and sunset, and inside the card she wrote the following: Death takes the body, God takes the soul, our minds hold the memories, our hearts hold the love, and our faith tells us we will

We as a congregation, have been blessed to experience the synodal process of prayer, reflection, dialogue, discernment, which leads to action and living our charism more fully the last many years.

Sr. Gifty Atampoka Abane, a member of the Society of the Child Jesus of Ghana shared about her experience for the synod. Perhaps it mirrors your experience or your hope for the Church.

"The synodal process awakens in me a new

consciousness of a journey in which the perfect, the imperfect, the seekers, the prophets, the weak and frail, the strong, the wise and foolish, the patient and enlightened, young people, older people, and children are united on a mission towards the Father's home.

The synod has ignited in me an intentional and conscious practice of being, listening, acting and meaningful dialogue. This change in mindset recognizes that each and every individual is an integral component of the family of God, each offering his or her very presence, gifts, and skills in service of the church in ways suitable to one's capabilities. It is a time to discard all forms of distinctions, segregation, discrimination, and exclusion based on limited human categorization of people. Instead, view all members of the same family,

# **Green Corner NWPA Synod Green Team**

Speaking of That's a Wrap, here are some ideas for earth-friendly wrapping. Consider using alternatives to traditional wrapping, such as:

- Newspaper or brown paper rolls (kids can decorate with markers or Christmas card cut-outs)
- Reusable shopping bags (preferably cotton)
- Re-use gift bags (make it fun see how many years you can use the same one)
- Recycled Christmas cards make great gift tags
- Wrap items in a t-shirt
- Wrap items in a tablecloth or blanket
- Instead of ribbon, use 100% cotton yarn (such as Sugar and Cream, available in many colors), use jute twine (100% biodegradable); add a fresh holly sprig for color



- Avoid shiny, glossy wrapping, as it is not recyclable
- If giving multiple gifts to a person/family, place them unwrapped in one (reusable) bag and have the recipient select one at a time. (No peeking inside first!)

## **COP 28- Dubai, United Arab Emirates**

### 30 November -12 December, 2023

When I first heard about a COP meeting, the only thing I knew was that it had something to do with climate. I began to research and learned that since the Rio Summit in 1992 and the launch of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), the Conference of the Parties to the Convention (COP) has convened member countries every year to determine ambition and responsibilities and to identify and assess climate measures. I remember the 21st session of the COP (COP21) that led to the Paris Agreement, which mobilized global collective action to limit the global temperature increase to 1.5C above preindustrial levels by 2100, and to act to adapt to the already existing effects of climate

change. This was very hopeful. Unfortunately, there has been no significant progress toward the goal.

On October 4, 2023, Pope Francis released his Apostolic Exhortation, Laudate Deum, In this exhortation he spends a great deal of time pointing out the progress and the failures of these meetings. The Pope states "if we are confident in the capacity of human beings to transcend their petty interests and to think in bigger terms, we can keep hoping the COP28 will allow for a decisive acceleration of energy transition, with effective commitments subject to monitoring. This conference can represent a change of direction, showing that everything done since 1992 was in fact serious and worth the effort, or else it will be a great disappointment and jeopardize whatever good has been achieved so far." (LD 54) Pope Francis is planning on attending COP28 in person. This is the first time a pope has attended. What can we do as individuals? We can pray. The Justice, Peace, and Integrity of Creation committee will be sending out some of the key statements from Laudate Deum for you to reflect on. As we reflect please also pray that the members who are participating will realize that if we are to care for our common home we must work together for the common good and the future of our planet.
