A Woman for Today

As I was preparing my presentation for the Associate candidate session last week, I reviewed the video, Mother St. John Frontbonne: A Woman for *Today.* In the video, Sister Donna Gunn, CSJ, portrays the role of Mother St. John. She tells "her story" of the history of the Sisters of St. Joseph. She begins by saying that many religious communities founded in the history of the church no longer exist. She believes the reason the Sisters of St. Joseph still exist more than 370 years since our founding is because God always sends us the right people at the right time, beginning with Father Medaille. "This is our history," she says. "To me, we would not

be CSJs without our connection to the laity. If not for Mother St. John's partnership with the Countess de la Rochjacquelen, a lay woman, we wouldn't have come to America. Mother St. John was willing to let go and allow six sisters to come to America."

As Sister Donna (as Mother St. John) spoke to the employees and staff at her motherhouse in Carondelet, she said, "You were called to be here. You are the right people now; you are the promise of hope that God so wants us to have. You are our moment now in history. You are our gift. Thank you."

As Í listened, I was reminded

of all the wonderful people that God sent to us, the employees at the CLC, the SSJ administrative staff, the dedicated staff who continue the work at our sponsored ministries, our Agrégées and Associates. I too believe that these people were called to join us, including the four new Associate candidates who are discerning their call.

In the words of Mother St. John, "Thank you for the gift of your lives, for being the persons you are. You are the right people now. You are the promise of hope that God so wants us to have." You are what continues to make the **SSJ Mission Possible**!

We know that women in the church are not seeking power or to relieve a feeling of inferiority, but they long to live in fidelity to God's mission in whatever form that call comes.



The synod is taking place at the Vatican Oct. 2023 and October 2024. Of the assembly's 465 participants, about 80 are women and, for the first time, 54 of those women are among the 365 full members of the assembly, who will be able to vote on its expected final document. This gives us hope!

LCWR Stands in Solidarity with the People of the Middle East

The members of the Leadership Conference of Women Religious (LCWR), in solidarity with the global community of faith, stand in the shadow of the horrors initiated on October 7, 2023 in Israel and Gaza. As women of the Gospel, we grieve with those who grieve, seek release of those held captive, and recognize the root causes of violence as well as the urgent call for the use of all possible resources to stabilize the Middle East, secure refuge for those in humanitarian crisis, and negotiate peace that will last. United with the interfaith community, we take seriously our responsibility to protect the safety of all people of faith throughout the world. We stand united with leaders of other faiths, intolerant of any form of hate or violence towards places of worship, and ready to witness to the transformation of consciousness necessary for sustainable peace.

National Catholic organizations urge Biden to call for ceasefire, humanitarian aid

"Continuing to send weapons increases dehumanization, destruction, and trauma." Washington - More than two dozen national Catholic organizations sent a letter to President Biden, urging him to take the necessary steps to de-escalate the conflict in Israel-Palestine, including calling for a humanitarian ceasefire and for all parties to prioritize corridors for humanitarian aid for the people in Gaza; and to prioritize steps to secure the immediate release of hostages and ensure international protection for civilians. Alarmed that the U.S. vetoed a U.N. Security Council resolution calling for a humanitarian pause in Israel's ongoing bombardment and siege of Gaza, and that President Biden's October 19 Oval Office address so heavily focused on sending more weapons to this conflict while ignoring its root causes, the Catholic leaders warned that this could "increase the dehumanization, destruction, and trauma of all communities involved."
