## Spring is upon us—a time of renewal.

Congratulations to the associates on their recommitment and to the agrégées on the renewal of their vow. While talking with a few associates who were discerning their recommitment, they expressed concern that they were unable to be as active or involved as much as they should be, most often because of the pandemic, health issues, or the aging process. As I listened, the words of the song **The Presence You Are**, by Jan Novotka came to mind.

*"It's not what you do but how*

*you do it; it's not what you see but how you see; it's not what you say, know or achieve but it's the presence, the presence you are."*

Living the SSJ charism and mission is not about "doing a lot." It is simply being present and reaching out to the dear neighbor without distinction. According to Eckhart Tolle, "when you're present with another, it's all about giving someone your time, energy and attention. In practical terms, it means truly paying attention to what they're

saying, doing, sharing, or asking."

This presence can be in the form of a phone call, visiting others using Facetime rather than just a call, sending a thinking of you note, a card, an email, or getting some friends together via ZOOM. I know of one group that gets together for a morning coffee hour once a week via ZOOM.

However you are able to reach out to the dear neighbor, this makes the **SSJ Mission Possible**.

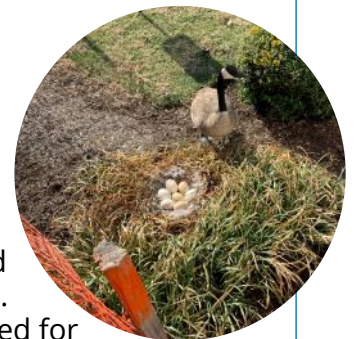
March 16<sup>th</sup>. A fence was put up to keep all of us away from them and to keep Gilbert away from us. This has only been somewhat successful!

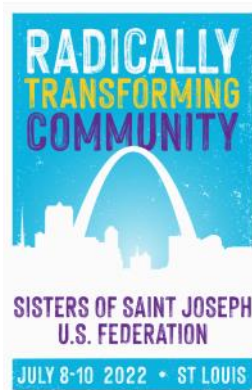

## Green Apple Award

Thank you to the teachers who submitted their environmental projects that they were able to accomplish even faced with teaching during a pandemic. Each

teacher will receive a certificate and a special plaque. Maria Ehrman from Our Lady of Peace School in Erie was able to complete a dragon fly pond activity and a water project with her 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students.

Wendy Sparks from St. Francis School in Clearfield teaches her third-grade students about the environment by reusing and repurposing items in all projects they do. They also use filtered water, have a classroom garden and a pet turtle.

Allison Stinely from the SSJ Neighborhood Network submitted two projects that the students they serve participate in urban farming and the bike program. The students who work in the garden learn the benefits of growing and harvesting their own food. The students who participate in the bike program learn about how recycling can create a usable product and how riding a bike can reduce their carbon footprint. Both these programs thrive under the watchful eye of Gretchen Gallagher Durney and Margarita Dangle and the many volunteers at the Neighborhood Network.

Becky Kelly who teaches 6-8 grades at St. Francis School in Clearfield has her students run the recycling program for the school. The waste is then taken to the local recycling center rather than the landfill.

We are grateful to these teachers and mentors for showing their students the importance of thinking "green." Their efforts will ensure that the next generation will do their part to protect our planet.
