More people than ever are still turning to the Food Bank for help this winter because of high gas and grocery prices, as well as the new challenges the pandemic brings every day.

Those rising prices, supply chain disruptions, uncertainty with COVID-19, and fewer food donations also mean that food banks are struggling to stay stocked. We are asking Congress to provide additional funding for The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) food purchases, such as fresh vegetables, milk, meat, and other staples. She teaches theology at Regis and St. Michael's College at the University of Toronto. Sister Mary is also the Vocation and First Formation Director for the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph in Canada.



Before entering the Congregation of Sisters of St. Joseph in Canada, Sister Mary worked as a nurse and nurse educator in England and later in ophthalmological and blindness prevention programs in Southeast Asia, China and the Indian sub-continent. She is also a clinical bioethicist. Sister Mary has a bachelor's degree in philosophy, a Master's in Medical Law and Ethics and a doctorate in Theology.



It was a phone call from the Sisters of St. Joseph Federation U.N. representative after the 2010 devastating earthquake in Haiti that initiated our relationship with Mission Haiti Inc., the Sisters of the Companions of Jesus, and ten girl-students in Haiti.

This past year, Haiti experienced another earthquake, a hurricane, the murder of their president, gang violence, and COVID-19. They are facing some of these hardships in already difficult levels of poverty.

The U.S. Federation of Sisters of St. Joseph has committed to another year of education for these girls, some of whom we have followed since grade one. We are blessed for the opportunity to make a difference in the lives of these girls and their families.
